

Punctuality

We have seen a number of pupils regularly arriving late to school. For many this is just five minutes a day, and many parents will think that 5 minutes doesn't really count. Let's take a look at how quickly 5 minutes adds up:

- In one week 5 minutes /day= 25 minutes of lost learning (the equivalent to a guided reading lesson)
- In one month 5 minutes/day = 1 hour 40 minutes (the equivalent of 3 maths lessons)
- In one term 5 minutes/day = 5 hours lost learning time (the equivalent of one day of lessons)
- In one year 5 minutes/day = 15 hours lost learning time (the equivalent of three days of lessons)

Five minutes really does count!!! Very quickly, your child is losing much learning time.
