Going Home

If someone other than one of their main carers is picking up your child, please inform a member of staff at the door in the morning. This also applies if your child is going home with another child in the class.

Labelling

Please ensure ALL items of clothing are named including shoes, water bottles and snack pots.

Snacks

School provides one piece of fruit per day per child. If you would like to send in an additional snack, please choose from the following list:

- Fresh fruit/ vegetables
- Raisins/dried fruit (NOT fruit winders etc)
- Cheese
- Bread sticks/cream crackers
- Dry crunchy cereal e.g. multigrain hoops, bran flakes (NOT cereal bars)
- Yogurt drink/yogurt tubes e.g. frubes

Independent skills

Please could you help your child be able to zip up their coat independently. Also, to be able to dress themselves for the colder weather e.g. putting on gloves/mittens and hats.

PE

This half term PE is on Tuesdays. On this day, please send your child to school in school uniform which is easy for them to change themselves. Tights and pinafore dresses are particularly tricky.

Spare Clothes

Please ensure borrowed spare clothes are returned to nursery. Furthermore, if you have any spare clothes to donate we are particularly running low on socks and tights.

Uniform

In line with the school policy please ensure that any hairbands children are wearing plain red or black. If your child has their ears pierced, they are only permitted to wear studs. Please be aware that your child will need to either have removed their earrings or have taped them for PE lessons. Be also note that members of staff are unable to assist with this. Ideally children
